What to Recite?

Choose to recite a passage you already know, or one you'd like to learn, or get a suggestion at recitationministry.com

How it Works

You will have time to prepare



Memorizing with the goal of reciting to yourself or another person is one thing; memorizing in order to recite to a large audience is more involved, and takes time—at least a month.

You stay in charge



The final say of when you are ready to recite rests with you—even up to the day of the planned recitation. If you feel that it will do you more harm than good to recite, then don't. It is always your choice.

You will be supported



There will always be somebody "on book" during a recitation—just in case you need a prompt—and someone to shepherd you through the process of preparing to recite.
